

### Honetsuki-dori Gaburi



### Rent Your Bicycle

#### Right Outside Onomichi Station!

You'll find several convenient bike rental spots near Onomichi Station. With a wide selection including battery-assisted bicycles, cross bikes, and kids bikes, everyone can enjoy the ride. Once you've got your wheels, head straight to Onomichi Port!

##### Shimanami Rental Bike (Onomichi Station Rental Cycle)

### Board the Ferry with Your Bicycle and Head to the Islands!

2. Always check for safety at intersections. Follow all traffic signals and stop signs.
3. Always use lights after dark.
4. Riding under the influence is strictly prohibited.
5. Please wear a helmet.
6. Control your speed on downhill sections.
7. Riding bicycles side by side is strictly prohibited.



### Step into History with Scenic Lighthouse Views

Just a 15-minute bike ride and walk from Shigei Higashi Port, the Ohamasaki Lighthouse has been guiding ships since 1894. Designated as a National Important Cultural Property for its significance in modern maritime history, it remains active today. Nearby, you'll find "Hassaku-ya," famous for its local specialty, "Hassaku Daifuku."
